This will help everyone get used to using the Accountability Tag appropriately, and to learn what to do when you are deployed.

As we approach the end of 2014, remember the deadline for all team members to be up to date on training in order to remain in Level 1 or Level 2 is June 30, 2015.

New Plan for Quarterly Team Training

The Training Committee recommended standardized quarterly team training be developed that can be presented in each region.
